# 2020 HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK, POULTRY AND BIRDS AT A COUNTY 4H/FFA FAIR EXHIBITION

ANY EVIDENCE OF WARTS, RINGWORM, FOOT ROT, PINK EYE, DRAINING ABSCESSES OR ANY OTHER CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS CONDITION WILL ELIMINATE THE ANIMAL FROM THE SHOW.

No individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspection will be required on Iowa origin animals or poultry exhibited at County 4-H/FFA FAIR, but the animals must be inspected when unloaded or shortly thereafter by an accredited veterinarian. Swine are required to be inspected either before being unloaded or before leaving a designated isolation and inspection area (prior to mixing with any other pigs). All animals moving from out of state into an Iowa county 4H/FFA fair must meet Iowa Animal and Livestock Importation requirements. Each show <u>must</u> have an official veterinarian.

Quarantined animals or animals from quarantined herds cannot be exhibited.

Official identification listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required for all cattle and bison of any age **coming in from out of state** used for rodeos, recreational events, shows and exhibitions.

#### **SWINE**

All swine must originate from a herd or area not under quarantine and must be individually identified. All swine arc required to have individual official identification. All 4-H and FFA tags bearing the US shield are official identification tags.

Swine originating outside of Iowa. All exhibitors must present a test record and Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that indicate that each swine has had a negative test for pseudorabies within 30 days prior to the show (individual show regulations may have more restrictive time restrictions), regardless of the status of the herd, and show individual official identification on test report. Electronic identification will not be considered official identification for exhibition purposes.

Swine exhibition requirements. "Swine exhibition" means an exhibit, demonstration, show, or competition involving an event on the state fairgrounds, a county fair, or other exhibition event. The sponsor of the exhibition must retain an Iowa licensed veterinarian to supervise the health of the swine at the exhibition location. The sponsor must electronically file the approved registration form and obtain approval from the state veterinarian at least 30 days before the event. The registration form includes the name of the exhibition and the address and telephone number of its location; the name, address and telephone number of the veterinarian; and the date of the planned exhibition. Sales of swine will not be allowed unless the event has been registered and received approval from the state veterinarian 30 days prior to the event.

Swine exhibition report required. The sponsor of the swine exhibition shall electronically submit to the department the approved report form within five business days after the conclusion of the exhibition. The form iincludes the name of the exhibition and the address and telephone number of its location; the name, address and telephone number of the veterinarian; the date that the exhibition occurred; the name, address and telephone number of the owner of the swine; and the address and telephone number of the premises from which the swine was moved after the exhibition if such premises is a different premise.

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2020 Iowa Exhibition Requirements

#### SHEEP AND GOATS

All sexually intact sheep must have an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin identification tag (Ex. IA1234-5678) or another official Scrapie tag. All sexually intact goats must be identified with an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin identification tag (Ex. IA 1234-5678), another official Scrapie tag, or by an official tattoo registered with USDA (to register, call 1-866-USDA-TAG; 1-866-873-2824). Wethers less than 18 months of age are required to have an individual identification and a scrapie tag may be used, but a scrapie tag is not required.

#### **POULTRY AND BIRDS**

All poultry exhibited must come from U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean or equivalent flocks, or have had a negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within 90 days of public exhibition and the test must have been performed by an authorized tester. (SEE GENERAL SECTION 1B) **Please note: Poultry purchased from a hatchery and raised for exhibition are not exempt from Pullorum-Typhoid testing requirements**.

However, "Market Classes" of poultry consigned to a slaughter establishment are exempt from the Salmonella testing requirements. "Market Classes" of poultry must be separated from all other poultry by a distance of ten or more feet and/or an eight-foot high solid partition.

#### **DOGS AND CATS**

All dogs and cats exhibited must have a current rabies vaccination cellificate.

#### **FARM DEER**

Accredited veterinarians must be approved to administer tuberculosis tests on Cervidae.

"Cervidae" means all animals belonging to the cervidae family, and "CWD susceptible cervidae" means white-tail deer, blacktail deer, mule deer, red deer, elk and moose. Native Iowa Cervidae may be exhibited without other testing requirements when accompanied by a Cellificate of Veterinary Inspection that lists individual official identification.

All Cervidae must have been part of the herd of origin for at least one year or were natural additions, or must have originated from a chronic wasting disease monitored or certified herd in which these animals have been kept for at least one year or were natural additions. Cervidae originating from a herd with a diagnosis, signs, epidemiological evidence, or area under quarantine for chronic wasting disease may not be exhibited. The following statement must appear on the Ce1tificate of Veterinary Inspection:

"All Cervidae on this certificate have been part of the herd of origin for at least one year or were natural additions to this herd. There has been no diagnosis, signs, or epidemiological evidence of chronic wasting disease in this herd for the past year."

#### Wapello County Fair Regulations and Open Classes Premium Lists

<u>Wapello Hall—Located at the Center of the Fair Grounds</u>

<u>Iowa Agricultural Hall - Located at the South End of the Fair Grounds</u>

#### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Exhibitors may register entries early. Entry tags may be received by mailing an entry fee \$5.00 for every 10 entries (i.e. 30 entries will be \$15.00) and Entry Form to Tammie Hemm. You will receive your tags and labels by return mail. Entries will not be received on the grounds, however, until entry day Tuesday June 10 for Wapello Hall and the Iowa Agricultural Hall.
- All articles or animals competing for premiums must possess more than ordinary merit. No article or animal deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium by the judge. Judges may award any grading of premium according to the merit of the animal or article.
- Anyone trying to deceive the management as to the grower of an exhibit, or who shall purchase articles or borrow them and exhibit them in his or her name as having been grown or executed by him or her, shall forfeit all claims as an exhibitor.
- Exhibitors will at times give the necessary personal attention to whatever they have on exhibition during the fair and take entire charge of the same immediately after the close of the fair.
- The greatest possible care will be used by the fair association to prevent loss, theft or injury to any article or animal on exhibition, but in no case shall the fair association become responsible for such loss or injury, should any occur.
- The Wapello County Regional Fair Association while using every precaution will not be responsible for loss or damage to any article or animal. Nor will an officer or employee of the fair be permitted to negotiate insurance or to make any guarantee whatsoever regarding the same. Property owners desiring insurance against fire or other protection, must make their own arrangements therefore. No officer or employee has any authority to suspend or change this rule.
- Articles must have been completed within the past two years.

#### RECEPTION OF ENTRIES

- Wapello Hall will be open to receive entries on Tues, June 10th from 5 pm to 7 pm and on Wednesday, June 11h from 9 am 3 pm.
- Iowa Agricultural Hall will be open on Tuesday June 10th from 5 pm to 7 pm and on Wednesday June 11th from 9 am 3 pm.
- Competition will be open to the world except as otherwise noted.
- Persons desiring to make entries in various departments will be required to pay, at time of entry, the necessary entrance fee and to secure exhibitor's ticket.
- No animal shall receive more than one premium except in herds of cattle or sweepstakes.
- Articles which are products of the soil must be entered by the producer and manufactured articles must be in manufacturer's or artist's own name.
- Every article or animal on the grounds during the fair shall be subject to control of the association and, while every precaution will be taken for the safety of same, the fair association will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- Exhibitors of thoroughbred or standard stock must establish their eligibility if called by judges or the superintendent.
- No animal or articles shall be taken from the grounds during the fair without the consent of the superintendent and secretary. A violation of this rule will forfeit all premiums due.
- Exhibitors will be expected to obey the superintendent or marshal promptly in producing their stock when requested to do so. Any person refusing to comply within ten minutes may be ruled out from competing.
- If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has in any ungentlemanly and in a public manner taken exception to awards of the judges, the board of directors may expel such offender from competing for a premium or exhibiting on the grounds, such penalty to be revoked only by three-fourths vote of the board.
- Any exhibitor who has made or accused to have been made, any false statement in regard to animals or articles exhibited or who-by letter, circular or otherwise-shall attempt to interfere with the judges while in the performance of their duties shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting on grounds of the Association.
- The Wapello County Fair, through its board, reserves the right to limit the payment of premiums in classes where there is no competition

Premiums for Wapello Hall and Iowa Agricultural Hall will be paid on Saturday, June 14th from 1:00-5:30 p.m. Items from the Agricultural Building cannot be removed until Saturday June 14th at 3:30 p.m. Early removal of items may lead to forfeiture of premiums. Judges decisions are Final.

#### **ATTENTION JUDGES**

The special attention to rules by the judges is requested for making awards. Much of the harmony and success of the fair depends upon the accuracy and knowledge of the judges and promptness with which they do their work. No protest against a judge will be considered unless a written statement of reason of protest is signed by the person protesting.

Where there is nothing in a class deserving a premium the judge shall make no awards. Lack of competition shall be no cause for withholding a premium if the animal or article be worthy of it.

Judges will be careful to put on ribbons and denoting proper premiums awarded and see that ribbons and report in entry books agree.

#### Blue denotes First Premium Red denotes Second Premium White denotes Third Premium

Weather conditions and unavoidable accidents or delays will always be considered, in fairness to exhibitors.

No person or persons shall be allowed to see the secretary's books until after entries are closed.

Exhibitors and visitors may have mail addressed in care of the secretary. A post office will be maintained in the secretary's office and exhibitors and others expecting mail may call for same each day.

The executive board reserves the right to withhold any money due for premiums or otherwise pending completed investigation if, in their opinion, such claims are based on false entry, false evidence, misrepresentations, fraud or violation of fixed rules published herein. If, in the opinion of the board, there has been fraud, the board shall, following investigation, withhold all such claims.

#### **SUPERINTENDENTS**

Superintendents will supervise the receiving of all property entered for exhibition, see that entry tags and cards are securely attached and attend to the arrangements of such property in a suitable and attractive manner.

In erroneous statements are made, superintendents will make the necessary corrections or cause such to be made in the official entry books before judges have examined such wrongly entered exhibits, but not after such examination.

Superintendents will point out to the judges of awards the articles or animals to be inspected and cause the same to be displayed in their proper places and at the proper time.

The management will consider it a favor if patrons will report any mistreatment or extortions practiced by an employee of the fair or concessionaires. **Do not wait until the fair is over to file a complaint; do it at once.** 

Superintendents or officers employing assistants shall keep the name, time, and amount of wages due each person and present that to the secretary with details for payment.

Each superintendent shall exercise great care in preserving and returning committee books upon the entries of awards in them and upon no other authority can premiums be paid.

#### **PROTEST**

Protest designed to affect an award must be made by an interested party. Notice must be given to the superintendent of the department before the examination of the protested article or an animal is concluded. A written statement, verified by affidavits, setting forth the reason of protesting, must be filed with the secretary on the day the article or animal is exhibited. A failure to fulfill this requirement will be considered as a waiver of such objectives by the party protesting.

In every case of protest, the protesting party shall deposit with the secretary an amount equal to the amount of premium at the time of making protest. Should the protest be denied, the money will be forfeited to the treasurer of the association.

#### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

Each person is required to purchase an exhibitor's ticket before making entries in any class.

#### **IOWA AGRICULTURAL BUILDING**

#### **FARM CROPS, FRUITS & VEGETABLES**

- All entries must have been grown in current year unless otherwise stated.
- An entry made for one class cannot be used to make up a collection in another class.
- The right to reject or re-class entries is reserved by the Superintendent.
- All entries for the Iowa Agricultural Hall should be listed on a separate entry form from any Hollenbeck Hall exhibits.
- Exhibitors are limited to two entries in each item in all classes.
- Containers will be furnished for all vegetable and fruit entries (except Basket and Jar classes).
- The Superintendent has the right to remove and dispose of spoiled items.

#### **IOWA YOUTH CODE OF ETHICS**

Youth are expected to be sincere, honest and act in sportsmanlike ways at all times. Youth represent the entire program and their behavior reflects on their parents, leaders, club and the entire youth program. All adults involved with the youth program, leaders as well as parents, are expected to set positive examples and serve as positive role models by what they say and do. Any youth who breaks the code of ethics or allows another person (adult or peer) to talk them into violating the code of ethics agrees to forfeit all prizes, awards and premiums. The youth may also be prohibited from exhibiting at this and future exhibitions including the Iowa State Fair and other county, state or regional exhibitions.

Youth agree to follow these guidelines:

- 1. I will do my own work, appropriate for my age and physical and mental development. This includes research and writing of exhibit explanations, preparing exhibits (such as sewing, cooking, refinishing, etc.), care and grooming of animals, etc. Adult assistance should help guide and support me, not do it for me.
- 2. All exhibits will be a true representation of my work. Any attempt to take credit for other's work, alter the conformation of animals, or alter their performance is prohibited. Copyright violation or allowing others to complete your exhibit is considered misrepresentation and is prohibited.
- 3. I will treat all people and animals with respect. I will provide appropriate care for animals.
- 4. I will present exhibits that are safe for consumption. All food exhibits will be safe to exhibit and for judges to evaluate. Other exhibits will be safe for judges to evaluate and for exhibition.
- 5. All food animals that may be harvested immediately following the show shall be safe for consumers, and shall have met all withdrawal times for all medications, and be free of violative drug residue.
- 6. If any animal requires medical treatment while at the fair or exhibition, only a licensed veterinarian may administer the treatment. All medications that are administered shall be done according to the label instructions of the medication used.
- 7. My animal's appearance or performance shall not be altered by any means, including medications, external applications and surgical procedures. Any animal that is found to have changed its appearance or its performance shall be disqualified from the show, and have penalties assessed against the exhibitor, parent and/or guardian by the management of the fair or exhibition.
- 8. I will follow all ownership and possession rules and, if requested, will provide the necessary documentation.
- 9. I will follow all livestock health requirements for this fair or exhibition, according to the state health requirements as printed in the premium book of the fair or exhibition. I will provide animal health certificates from a licensed veterinarian upon request from the management of the fair or exhibition.
- 10. By my entering an animal in this fair or exhibition, I am giving consent to the management of the fair or exhibition to obtain any specimens of urine, salvia, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. If the laboratory report on the analysis of any sample indicates a presence of forbidden drugs, this shall be evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the exhibitor, parent and/or guardian to prove otherwise.
- 11. I am responsible for my exhibit and I will not allow others to violate this code on my behalf. By my entering an exhibit in this fair or exhibition I will accept any disciplinary action taken by the management of this fair or exhibition for any violation of this code of ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or exhibition without recourse against the fair or exhibition.
- 12. I want my exhibit to be an example of how to accept what life has to offer both, good and not so good, and how live with and learn from the outcome.
- 13. I will not be involved in any illegal activities while participating in FFA events, including but not limited to alcohol, tobacco or drug use. I agree to conduct myself in an honest, ethical, and upstanding manner and I understand that disciplinary actions will result if these rules are violated. I understand that I am expected to represent the program in a positive manner. I have read, understand and agree to follow this code of ethics, and any other rules of competition of the fair or exhibition as printed in its premium book.

Riding or driving on the race track by any person or persons during the fair, except when competing for premiums, is strictly forbidden. The association will not be responsible for any damage to persons or property resulting from their being on the track. The general public is hereby warned that the track is dangerous territory during the exhibition hours and at all times.

#### **CAMPING REGULATIONS**

(319) 316 3500 Ron Potts

The campground and trailer camp shall be under the supervision of the campground superintendent and the supervision of the superintendent of police. It shall be their duty to see that order is preserved.

#### Camping will be prohibited except in designated areas.

Camping will be reserved by numbered post. Electrical rate will begin the day of hook up.

The camping fee shall be \$15.00 per day. The camping fee will also be charged in race horse barn area.

#### No electric stoves or air conditioners are allowed on any campground electrical connections.

The fair association will not be liable for any electric equipment or damage thereto because of variations in electrical current. The fair association will not be liable for the theft of any article or the damage of any article by fire or any act of God. No minor will be allowed to stay overnight in the campground without adult supervision. The fair association reserves the right to remove anyone from the campground for any reason.

Only one car will be allowed per camp site. All autos must be parked beside the tent or trailer. Parking in the roadway is prohibited.

Fast driving in the campground area is strictly prohibited!!!

#### **RULES FOR PERMITS AND CONCESSIONS**

(319) 316 3500 Ron Potts

The superintendent of concessions shall sell all permits and privileges, locate all tents and stands of privileged purchasers and may annul any permit, at any time, for satisfactory cause.

Privileges must be in place and paid in full to the superintendent by the first day of the fair. All booths must be manned from 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 P.M. each day starting first day of fair. Any deviation from any part of this provision will work a forfeiture of privilege. No portion of a space or booth may be sublet without approval of the superintendent.

The board will carefully guard against extortion in any form being practiced on the patrons of the fair. A violation of this rule will cause the forfeiture of contract, money paid and expulsion from the grounds, as superintendent or board may elect. The board authorizes the letting of only such concessions as are required to supply the necessary wants of the people, or that may add to their comfort, convenience and pleasure, but under no circumstances will concessions of a questionable nature or of a demoralizing tendency be let or tolerated upon the grounds or in the building, nor will any concessions be sold or permitted where the business is conducted in other than legitimate and trade-like manner.

All dining halls, lunch booths and refreshment stands must be substantial in structure and neat in appearance. They must be supplied with wholesome food and pure, honest goods sold at reasonable prices. They must also have the proper licenses and meet all state food and health requirements.

#### **ADMISSION RULES**

There will be **FREE GATE & PARKING**. Automobiles are not permitted to travel about the grounds except as is necessary to go and return.

#### **REGULATIONS**

The management of the Wapello County Fair reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle all matters, questions and differences in regard hereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to this fair.
